Juvenile crime more than doubles between 3p.m.-7p.m.

Some 14,000 Arizona youth will drop out of school this year.

Our Clubs provide more than 144,000 hours of homework help and educational enrichment activities to youth each year.

Some 5 million children are left home alone after school.

Caring adult mentors and skill building programs help youth increase self-confidence, make friends and make a meaningful investment in their community.

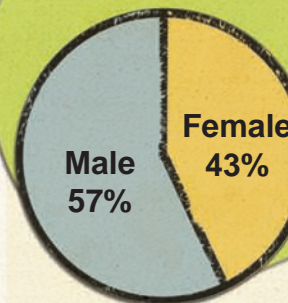

ECONOMIC REPORT

80% of the youth we serve represent minority groups.

60% of our members live in households headed by a single parent or guardian.



Nearly half live in households surviving at or below the poverty level (for instance in 2011 just \$22,350 for a family of four).

The Economic Impact Study



Every \$1 spent by Valley of the Sun Boys & Girls Clubs generates \$19.33 in positive economic impact for the community

Reductions in youth crime rates and savings to community:

Annual Community Benefit - \$19.9 million

Lowering of tendency to abuse substances and costs associated with underage drinking:

Annual Community Benefit - \$22.6 million

Affordable programs enable parents to work and/or attend school knowing their children are in a safe, positive environment:

Annual Community Benefit - \$220.7 million

To determine the Clubs' regional impact, researchers used the combined operating and capital budgets and the value of volunteer services:

Annual Community Benefit - \$41.7 million

Higher graduation rates and improved lifetime earnings of Club members:

Lifetime Community Benefit - \$22.8 million

Lower teen pregnancy and motherhood rates create economic savings:

Lifetime Community Benefit - \$10.8 million

Damoei Global Research compared the aggregate operating budget of Valley of the Sun Boys & Girls Clubs (\$16.8 million) with the positive economic impact that the Clubs generate in several major areas for the community, club members and their parents. Data was obtained from surveys completed by a random sample of Club members and parents at all 31 sites, questionnaires completed by staff, as well as county, state and nationwide studies.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Metropolitan Phoenix: Club Members

84% think going to college is important for their future life and success.

87% feel that participating in physical activities at the Club is beneficial to them.

93% like participating in the Club's programs.

77% plan to attend college or other post-secondary school after graduation.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Metropolitan Phoenix: Parents

94% work outside the home.

83% say that the Clubs enable them to keep their job.

97% agree that their children are in a safe environment at the Club.

78% say that their children complete homework assignments more often.

89% feel that their children have gained self-confidence, **91%** feel they are better able to make friends.

85% feel they have shown more interest in exercise and **66%** feel that their children make better choices about food and drink.

67% find that the cost of childcare is the greatest challenge they have in providing for their children. The affordability of the Clubs is critically important to their ability to work and/or attend school.

80% say that their children have improved their school performance and **79%** feel that their children enjoy school more.
